
THE *V*ISION MISSION

The Vision Mission is a Non-Profit, Social Enterprise we have started. Our aim is to work towards eradicating curable blindness in the [developing world](http://www.thevisionmission.org/). Our objective is to serve as a conduit enabling transnational collaboration of dedicated ophthalmic experts in providing free high quality eye care and surgery to patients in areas of need, with a view to eradicate treatable vision impairment and allow eye care access to all in Asia.

Our idea is to bring in various kinds of speciality expertise, training, funding and so on for these remote areas, such that we can upgrade their setups to function as a tertiary centre for those regions.

In short, we look for a locality:

- (1) With high proportion of population living under poor socio-economic circumstances
- (2) Undersupplied by local ophthalmologists but with available functioning ophthalmic operating setup
- (3) A passionate local team of eye care experts that is willing to work with international teams and keen on augmenting their local setup to extend the reach of high quality general and subspecialist ophthalmic care to the needy in the region

Potential Partners

We are looking to build partnerships in various countries with which we can expand our reach, and support more people who need it. We normally look for a local partner in the country we wish to operate with some if not all of the following characteristics:

1. Have a basic local medical setup, with an operating theatre and basic equipment
2. Have trained doctors and nurses at hand
3. Have access to the local population and are able to bring in patients who require surgery / They are able to publicize effectively free eye camps, and ensure good turnout at events.

- Surgical Process Optimization
- Tele-Ophthalmology
- Training - Surgical and Optometric
- Second Opinion on Complex Ophthalmic Problems
